Starting in Spring 2014, the Central Broadway/Winter HII Streetscape Improvements project will take a new look at the central section of the historic Broadway corridor. The project team will evaluate existing and future transportation needs and integrate this analysis with neighborhood feedback to prepare a new streetscape design. Building on the broad goals of the SomerVision Comprehensive Plan and previous planning studies, we'll work towards a design that will improve the safety and functionality of the confort for all modes.




